## FROM THE PASTOR THOSE LAZY, HAZY, CRAZY DAYS OF SUMMER

Pastors, like me, and other church leaders, tend to breathe a sigh of relief as we enter the summer months. There is a sense that June, July, and August will provide a much-needed respite from the marathon of church seasons. We kick off with a new program year in the fall that keeps us jogging towards the sprint that is Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. By the time the month of May wraps up, we often feel like we've finished a grueling race and look forward to a time that offers a slower pace and an opportunity to catch our breath. I've learned that this is more of a dream than an actual reality. While the pace does indeed change in the summer months, there is still a lot of activity – and a lot of that activity is great!

Our church marked the beginning of the summer season with a joyous romp through the wild west as we combined forces with our neighbors, Trinity Lutheran Church, to host a fun and exciting vacation Bible school program called Monumental. Over the course of four packed, energetic evenings, more than 70 children learned new songs, participated in fun activities, and made new friends as they stepped into the biblical story of Joseph.

Following the week of VBS, I had the opportunity to travel to Pittsburgh Theological Seminary for my third week-long intensive course in my Doctor of Ministry degree program. Though the school packed our schedules full for the week, it felt great to be in the classroom again. This week was especially meaningful as it marked the first time that our entire cohort was together in person. After studying with one another virtually for an entire year we shared a "family reunion" atmosphere within the group.

Summer also marked some significant events in the life of the presbytery and the wider church. At the end of June, the Huntingdon Presbytery voted to call Elder Kate Sillman as Huntingdon Presbytery's new General Presbyter. Kate had been serving as our interim GP and has done exceedingly well. She is a delightful and caring individual. She will serve our area's congregations and pastors with compassion and wisdom.

In a time when many of our local congregations yearn for the consistent presence of wise and compassionate leaders, we got to celebrate and bear witness to a great demonstration of our denomination's emphasis on interconnectedness. Elder Stan Howes, one of our own, was commissioned as a Lay Pastor for the First Presbyterian Church of Frostburg, Maryland. His presence and ministry there show how churches and presbyteries can support one another. Stan's commissioning service was a joy to be a part of, and I know that Stan will continue to serve Frostburg, our own congregation, and the wider church with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love.

One of the threads that connects all of these activities and events – VBS, my seminary class, and the designation of new leadership roles – is the reality of our interconnectedness. We cannot exist apart from other people, and the church cannot be the church without being in relationship with other churches and the broader community. We need one another. More importantly, we cannot be who we are called to be apart from these connections and relationships. Just as the Church cannot exist apart from Christ, the Church cannot be the Church apart from its mission to reach out to people to proclaim the good news of the Gospel and work for the transformation of all creation. With such a robust mission statement, is it any wonder we cannot do this on our own?

As the summer winds down and we return to familiar patterns and a different pace, may we remember that whatever season we are in, we are a part of the church and involved in Christ's work in the world and for the world. We can't do this alone. Give thanks that we don't do this alone.


## Annual Church Picnic


